



Campbell Street Resurfacing & Columbus-Scott-Campbell Intersection Project Phase 1 & 2

Project Description

The City of Sandusky has entered into contract with Ed Burdue & Company, LLC, for the Campbell Street Resurfacing and Columbus-Scott-Campbell Intersection Project Phase 1 & 2. The project consists of milling the asphalt pavement, removal and replacement of damaged concrete curbs and gutters, as well as removal and replacement of select sidewalks and new handicap ramps.

Utility improvements with this project include the removal and replacement of the existing water main from North Depot Street to the main on the south side of the tracks, installation of a new water main, between Bell Avenue and Columbus Avenue and replacement of the 15" sanitary sewer from West Osborne Street to just north of the tracks. In addition, the portion of the sanitary sewer laterals within the right of way may be repaired and reconnected as-needed during inspection. This project will include Phases 1 & 2 of the Columbus-Scott-Campbell Intersection Project with the replacement of curbs, sidewalks and handicap ramps, as well as underground infrastructure for future pedestrian and traffic signals that will be installed during Phase 3 later this year or early in 2019.

Construction Activity *Updated 4/3/2018*****

The contractor will be performing underground utility work in the below specified areas starting Monday, April 2nd, which will cause the following road closures;

Monday, April 2nd to Friday, April 6th from 7:00am to 5:00pm the following road closure will be in place in order to install the new sewer main;

- Campbell St, between Taylor St and N Depot St will be closed to all vehicular traffic

NO PARKING SIGNS will be posted in various locations along Campbell St between Tyler St and Columbus Ave and between Taylor St and W Osborne St. Parking will be prohibited in these areas, with the date and timeframe indicated on the signs.

During all road closures, signs will be set up notifying vehicular traffic of the closure. The contractor will maintain access to all emergency vehicles and residents to the specific road closure areas. We ask the public to use extreme caution when traveling this area and be mindful of all construction vehicles, equipment and workers. Please remember that Campbell is no longer a designated truck route for thru trucks.
