While speaking with the owner of the Nissan Pathfinder (FLM8870), Joseph Easley, he advised he was at an address, on Huntington Ave. with some friends. (He could not give the exact address). Joseph advised at around 11pm he walked his intoxicated friend home to an address on Dixon Dr. and left his vehicle parked on Huntington Ave. Joseph advised from his friend's house, he then walked to his address, at 1486 Dixon Dr. and went to sleep. Joseph said that he must have left his keys in the Nissan, and someone at that address took his Nissan.

A Kyocera flip phone was recovered from inside the Nissan at the accident scene. This phone was brought on station and attempts to locate the owner, (for a check of their well being), were made. On station, the recovered phone was receiving a phone call from 419-357-9466. Ofc. Ritterbach, in attempts to locate the owner of the phone, answered same. The caller was found to be Joseph Easley. Joseph mistook Ofc. Ritterbach for the owner of the phone. Joseph, stated to whom he believes is the owner of the phone, "don't mention my name, I told the police that the car was stolen". Joseph then terminated the call.

Officers arrived at 1486 Dixon Dr. to speak Joseph Easley regarding the accident. When confronted with the fact that he spoke with an officer when he called the phone on station, he admitted to giving false information to officers during the accident investigation. Joseph advised he loaned his vehicle to a subject with the nickname, "Boopie", for crack. Joseph advised he did not know the real name of "Boopie", and said that he recently meet "Boopie" through his girlfriend. Joseph was advised he was under arrest for Falsification. He was placed in hand restraints and seated in the rear of my cruiser. Joseph was then transported on station for charges. On station, a possible name of, James Charleton, was located for the nickname, "Boopie". Joseph was uncooperative and refused to view a photo line up containing James Charleton.

I completed a charge of falsification (M1), and served it to Joseph. Joseph advised he understood the charge and signed a recog. He was then released from station.

In an attempt to locate the driver and possible passengers of the vehicle, I located a number in the recovered phones contacts, that had the title of "Dad". I called this number and made contact with a, Charles Charleton, who advised he was the father of James Charleton. Charles advised that James' nickname was "Boopie". Charles advised that the phone recovered from the accident belonged to James. Charles advised that James lives with him at 1325 Huntington Ave. Charles advised that his son was not home, but he would have James contact this department when he returns. Charles was thanked for his time.

Attempts to make contact with James Charleton will be made as time permits.

- 2) Carhart jacket - interior of the Nissan - Ofc. West

Officers were advised of a roll over crash in the area of E. Monroe St. and Hancock St. Upon my arrival, I located a maroon 2002 Nissan Pathfinder (FLM8870) on it's passenger side on the north side of E. Monroe St. The Nissan was across from 220 E. Monroe. The Nissan's headlights were on, as well as it's windshield wipers. The rear of the Nissan was resting against a tree.

The Nissan was checked and no one was located in or around the vehicle. The keys were found in the ignition in the on position and the radio was playing. The Nissan was found to have damage to the right rear of the vehicle. This damage was not consistent with possibly hitting the tree as the damage did not match up.

I also observed a gold 2007 Chevy Equinox (GDX8349) further down the street at Monroe and Hancock. There was a debris field and fluid trail leading from the point of impact, which was in front of 216 E. Monroe St. to the Chevy. There was also no one in or around this vehicle. The Chevy had heavy disabling damage to the left front area. There was maroon paint transfer in the damaged area.

SFD also arrived and assisted in checking the area for any occupants of the two vehicles. Again, no one was located. After speaking with Sgt. Susana, OSP was contacted to assist in the accident investigation. OSP agreed and Sgt. Knoll responded on scene and began the crash investigation.

Ownership on the Nissan was checked and it was found to come back to Joe Easley. Dispatch was able to locate a phone number for Joe and he was contacted. When asked about his vehicle, Joe told dispatch that he had left his Nissan parked at a friend's house on Huntington Ave., but he could not recall the name of the friend. Joe then advised he would respond to the scene. Ofc. Lambert located Joe walking from the Sunnyside area and transported him to the scene.

Joe was spoken with and he stated he had left his vehicle at an unknown friend's house on Huntington. He could not recall if he left the keys to the vehicle at the house or if he took them with him. Joe said he did not know who would have been driving his vehicle.

The ownership of the Chevy was checked and it was found to be registered to Bernall McKinney. Dispatch contacted Bernall and she said she would respond to the scene. Ofc. Ommert located her at her residence and transported her to the scene. Bernall was spoken

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with and when asked, she advised her son, Darryl Pearson, had her vehicle. She said he borrowed the car last night. Bernall said she left him a voice mail around 0100 hours this date telling him to get her vehicle back to her. She said she does not know where Darryl would be at this time.

In speaking with Sgt. Knoll, it appears the Nissan was traveling eastbound in the 200 block of E. Monroe St. It also appears the Chevy was also traveling eastbound in the 200 block of E. Monroe St. behind the Nissan. It appears the Chevy was traveling at a high rate of speed and struck the right rear area of the Nissan with it's left front area. The force of the impact caused the Nissan to fishtail and slide across the street, hitting the curb which caused it to land on it's passenger side. The Chevy continued eastbound until it stopped at Hancock St. It appears any occupants of the Nissan exited out the rear hatch window, which had been broken out as a result of the crash.

Once OSP was complete with their investigation, wreckers were summoned to tow the vehicles. Prior to the wreckers responding, a cell phone was heard ringing periodically from inside the Nissan. Fosters responded to tow the Nissan. Once the Nissan was up righted, it was checked for any evidence as to who may have been driving it. A cell phone was located and it was found to have several missed calls after the time of the crash. Joe advised the cell phone was not his. Joe also pointed out a black Carhart jacket he claimed was not his. The cell phone and jacket were retained and later placed into evidence.

TNT responded and towed the Chevy. Prior to towing the vehicle, Ofc. Ommert checked the vehicle and located a cell phone on the driver's side floorboard. Upon seeing the cell phone, Bernall identified it as being Darryl's cell phone. Further to follow.
